On July 31, 1715, a Spanish treasure fleet sailed into oblivion. The fleet was comprised of five ships of the Nueva España Flota, commanded by Captain-General Juan Esteban de Ubilla, six ships of the squadron of Tierra Firme, commanded by Captain-General Don Antonio de Echeverz y Zubiza and the French frigate Le Grifon, commanded by Captain Antoine d'Aire. Le Grifon was not a part of Ubilla's flota or Echeverz's squadron but just happened to be in Havana at the time of their departure and received permission to accompany the fleet back to Europe for protection against the many marauding pirates that roamed the seas. Altogether, eleven vessels, more than 15 million pesos in registered treasure, and 700 lives were lost in one of the worst disasters in maritime history. The destruction of the 1715 Fleet was a disaster of catastrophic proportions, not just for the people directly involved, but the loss of the fleet had worldwide political and economic ramifications as well. The wrecks were discovered by Kip Wagner and the Real Eight Company in the 1960s. Altogether the Real Eight Company recovered nearly \$30,000,000 in gold, silver, and jewelry from the 1715 Fleet wreck sites. Probably starting around 1963 or so, the Real Eight Company began issuing "treasure certificates." The certificates and the

coins that accompanied them were "authentic treasure" carried aboard Spanish galleons that sank off the coast of Florida during a hurricane in 1715 and salvaged more than two centuries later by the Real Eight Company. The designs, artwork, and features of these Certificates of Authenticity or COA's evolved and changed over time. The purpose of this book is to analyze and discuss the evolution of what I will refer to as the "Official 1715 Fleet Certificates of Authenticity." Basically, the treasure certificates created by those companies and affiliated individuals who owned the Florida State leases and Federal Admiralty rights to salvage sunken treasure from the 1715 Fleet shipwrecks. These companies include, in chronological order, the Real Eight Company, Inc.; Treasure Salvor's Inc.; Cobb Coin Company; and 1715 Fleet - Queen's Jewels, LLC.
